## REFLECTION FOR SUNDAY

The Solemnity of Christ the King calls us to reflect on the true nature of Jesus' kingship. Today, we read about His encounter with Pilate, where Jesus declares, "My kingdom is not of this world". Unlike earthly rulers, Christ does not reign through force or political power but through truth and love. His kingdom is built on justice, mercy, and peace, values that often challenge worldly priorities. Jesus invites us to recognize Him as King of our hearts, surrendering our lives to His will. This feast reminds us that Christ's authority extends over all creation, yet He reigns humbly, offering Himself as a servant and sacrifice. His crown was made of thorns, and His throne was the cross. Through His suffering, death, and resurrection, Jesus conquered sin and death, inviting us to share in His victory. We are called to live as citizens of His kingdom by following His example of humility, compassion, and truth. Acknowledging Christ as King means making Him the center of our lives and allowing His teachings to guide our actions. It requires us to reject the false idols of power, wealth, and status that tempt us daily. Instead, we are called to serve others, especially the poor, vulnerable, and marginalized, as Christ Himself did.
