SUNDAY REFLECTION

An angel appeared to Mother Mary to announce the Incarnation. An angel appeared to Saint Joseph in a dream to assure him this child was of God. And now an angel appeared to some poor, uneducated and humble shepherds in a field near the city of Bethlehem. This angel did not appear to the scribes and Pharisees, or to the temporal rulers, or the highly educated. The angel of God appeared to shepherds. But it was not only one angel that appeared to proclaim this good news. Scripture says:

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

“Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased!” (Luke 2:13–14)

This humble event of the birth of the Savior of the world was something that not only caused the multitude of the heavenly hosts to give glory and adoration to God, it was an event that also invited those humble shepherds to join in this same adoration and praise of God.

Those humble shepherds also invite you to humble yourself before the great mystery of the birth of Christ. As you do, you hear the angel announce Christ's birth to you. And as you assent in faith to this glorious event, you are invited to join in the chorus of praise of the multitude of the heavenly host.
