

Our Goal for Church Ceiling is: \$31,700

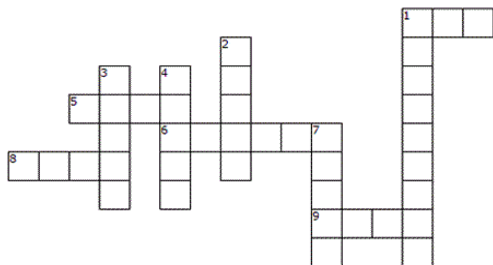

- Vestment renewal and refreshment.

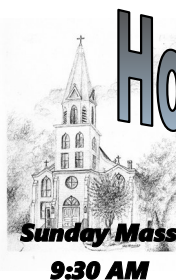

A Reading from the Book of Job (38:1,8-11)

The Lord addressed Job out of the storm and said: Who shut within doors the sea, when it burst forth from the womb; when I made the clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling bands? When I set limits for it and fastened the bar of its door, and said: Thus far shall you come but no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stilled!

This is the Word of the Lord.

The love of Christ impels us, once we have come to the conviction that one died for all; therefore, all have died. He indeed died for all, so that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised. Consequently, from now on we regard no one according to the flesh; even if we once knew Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know him so no longer. So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark (4:35-41)

On that day, as evening drew on, Jesus said to his disciples: "Let us cross to the other side." Leaving the crowd, they took Jesus with them in the boat just as he was. And other boats were with him. A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" They were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Bible Reflection

In today's Gospel we see the disciples trying to escape from the crowds by the boat and they were caught by the storm in the middle of the sea of Galilee. The apostles try to cope on their own but eventually they have to wake up Jesus asking for His assistance. Finally He calmed the storm. Like the disciples we can feel that we need a break because we have been working so hard sometimes. If a storm comes we resent it; did we not deserve the break? We try to cope using our own resources. But soon we panic and realize that we need to wake up the Lord that we have allowed to sleep within us. Let us remember this: when we turn to Him in trusting prayer he always assists us and restores peace to our hearts and to our surroundings.
